## Relationships

- All hands on deck approach - Every student matters!
- Achievement Team and Care Team processes systemically in place to support students in a proactive way
- Reduced suspensions for insubordination by focusing on improving teacher-student relationships


## Supporting Positive Social/Emotional Development

Students in crisis or those with special needs are supported in proactive ways through myriad resources:

- Restorative Justice
- Counselors, Psychologists, Social Workers
- Building Intervention Specialists
- Community resources, such as:

$\checkmark$ Neutral Zone
$\checkmark$ Community Mental Health
$\checkmark$ Communication Action Network
- Coordinated by the individual school Achievement Teams
