- Increase students' familiarity and sense of connection to high school support system(s) and at least one staff mentor and peer-supporter
- Increase family empowerment and connection with school teams

Extended School Year services are offered to PK-12 Special Education students with IEPs who were found eligible for services based on criteria set by MDE.
