....has a staff that communicates a sense of confidence and security to students and families.


...engages all stakeholders, staff, parents, students, law enforcement and the community, to create healthy and happy learning environments.

### Fall 2022 Update

- School Security Facility, Policy & Protocol Assessments
  - Secured Education Consultants (SEC) walk-through security assessment of every AAPS campus
  - o 2018 / High Schools Jan. 2022 / MS, K-8, Elem, Preschool Oct. 2022
- Door Protocol Reminders
  - External doors locked at all times except for beginning of school with adult supervision
  - Classroom and internal doors locked at all times propped or closed
- Visitor Management System
- Partnership with Local Law Enforcement
  - Unified Command Training
  - Emergency Tabletop Exercise last May
  - Meeting with Superintendents & Joint Chiefs
- Emergency Operation Plan (EOP) Update
  - School EOPs

- Student email monitoring Securly 24/7/12 months
  - Sept. 2021 Oct.10, 2022
    - 24 Extreme Risk
    - 348 Increased Risk
    - 325 Moderate Risk
      - 603 parents monitor 977 student emails
- Threat Assessment Tool
   CSTAG (Comprehensive Threat Assessment Guidelines),
   in additional to Columbia Suicide Assessment
- Partnerships continue with Community Mental Health
   & UM Psychiatric ED
