We understand that your time is valuable, and we appreciate your commitment to your child's education. If you encounter any challenges or have specific scheduling needs, please don't hesitate to reach out to your child's teacher, and we will do our best to accommodate you.

### Parent Teacher Conference Sign-Up Instructions

PTCFast.com is the website we have used for the past few years now, and it works quite well for the purpose of scheduling conferences. As in years prior, you will receive an individual email from each teacher you have signed-up to meet with. If you signed-up to meet with 4 teachers, you will receive 4 separate confirmation emails. Please do not sign-up for more than one time slot with each teacher. Please leave at least 5 minutes between scheduled conferences and do not schedule back to back sessions.

If you haven't yet used PTCFast.com, you should be pleasantly surprised at how simple you will find the process. There are no codes to enter and there is only one website to visit. The conferences are listed alphabetically by the teacher's last name, and you will only need an email

address to make your selections. The conference sign ups are now open, but they will fill up soon, so don't wait!

## SAEBRS Mental Health Screener for all students next week

In our efforts to support the well-being of all our students, Skyline High School will be administering a universal assessment of social, emotional & behavioral health to all students. Below is a disclosure statement with information about the screener. Please take a moment to read the information below. If you choose not to allow your student to participate, you may use the link below to opt out.

#### STUDENT WELL-BEING SCREENER DISCLOSURE

Skyline staff care deeply about our students, and we want to check in with all students to assess how they are doing. To assist us in this effort, we administer a behavioral wellness screener to all of our students. The SAEBRS (The Social, Academic, and Emotional Behavior Risk Screener) is a brief and research-validated self-rating scale that is completed by students. This information helps us to understand the needs of all our students and to make effective plans at the whole school, class, and individual level.

A member of our screening & support team will follow up with any student whose scores indicate they may need additional support. This school year, Skyline High School will be administering the screener 2 times: in January and April during Skytime classes. If you would like additional information about this universal assessment and student supports we have at Skyline High School please reach out to Heather Schimmel or Jacinta Nafziger.

#### **CONFIDENTIALITY STATEMENT**

Results of this screener will only be reviewed by district mental health professionals and shared with appropriate staff and/or parents on a need to know basis. The screener is *not being used to provide a diagnosis or to treat any mental health conditions*, but rather as a guide to determine the current behavioral well-being of our student population.

#### **OPT OUT**

If you have no objection to the screener, no further action is necessary, and your student will participate. If you would prefer that your student NOT participate in this screening during this school year, please complete this form by January 16, 2024. If you have multiple students at Skyline High School, please complete the survey for each student. You will receive a separate e-mail for each student. If you opted your

student out of the survey during a previous school year, you will need to opt them out again for this school year.

**Athletics Update** 

Dear Skyline Families,

High school games are about competition, building community, and fostering sportsmanship from the start to the end! To ensure that everyone has a great time, we kindly ask for your cooperation in adhering to the following spectator expectations:

**Respect All Individuals:** Treat all players, coaches, officials, and fellow spectators with respect and courtesy. Remember that everyone is here to enjoy the game.

**Positive Sportsmanship:** Cheer for your team enthusiastically, but avoid negative comments or behavior that may incite conflict. We support good sportsmanship, both on and off the field.

**Stay in Designated Areas:** Spectators are required to watch the game from designated areas, such as the bleachers or designated standing areas. Please avoid entering the playing area at any time.

**Follow Game Rules:** Familiarize yourself with the rules of the game and respect the decisions made by the officials. Keep in mind that officials are an essential part of the game.

**Alcohol and Substance-Free:** High school games are alcohol and substance-free events. Please refrain from bringing or consuming alcoholic beverages or any illegal substances on school property.

**Encourage Positive Behavior:** Please notify the event staff or security personnel if you witness inappropriate behavior or conflicts in the stands. Let's work together to address any issues promptly.

**Support Our School:** Show your support for our school by wearing school colors (Columbia and Navy Blue, & White) or apparel and displaying team spirit in a positive and respectful manner.

**Be Patient & Cooperative:** Expect crowd congestion, especially during high-attendance games. Be patient and cooperative with event staff and fellow spectators to ensure a smooth and enjoyable experience for all. Students should not enter basketball games this winter with book bags. Student-athletes competing are asked to place their book bags in their designated team space.

High school **athletic events/games** provide an excellent opportunity for our community to come together and celebrate. Your cooperation in following these expectations will help create a positive atmosphere and make our games a source of pride for our school community.

Parents, please ensure you arrive to pick up students on time. Students who are not picked up in a timely manner could have their spectator privileges suspended. Please make a plan for drop-off and pick-up for your student/student-athlete.

Cursing or refusing to follow the directions of event staff, administration, or a helping adult could result in being removed from the game and having spectator privileges suspended.

We appreciate community support and want all of our spectators to feel welcomed and comfortable as we model our commitment. Parents, please speak with your students about general expectations for attending sporting events (i.e., following the directions of adults, using appropriate language, not throwing items, remaining in their seats focused on the game/event, and cheering our Skyline Eagles on to victory).

These expectations are in place to maintain a positive and secure environment for everyone present at our games. While we hope that such situations rarely occur, we must take necessary precautions to protect the well-being and experience of our spectators, players, and staff.



Each event begins with a presentation by gap year advisors and alumni. These gap year experts provide attendees with a rich overview of the gap year option, share relevant data, highlight authentic student experiences, and offer tips and resources to help guide families through gap year research.
