Attendance and Tardy Notifications

Skyline High School and the Ann Arbor Public Schools encourage regular attendance in school by all of our students. Absences and tardies disrupt a student's learning process, and much of what happens in the classroom environment cannot be replicated for a student who misses time in class.

Teachers will continue to reach out to families when students accumulate 4 or more tardies in each class. Administration is also tracking tardies from a building level. Below is information from our Skyline Handbook:

Excused Absences – parent/guardian has notified the school within the required timeframe as to the reason and length of time the student will not be attending.

- a. Parent(s) / guardian must call the specific attendance line at (734) 994-7842 within 48 hours to excuse all absences and tardies.
- b. Parents(s) / guardian must provide one of the valid reasons (as listed above) for their student's absence or tardy.
- c. Students have the responsibility to notify and make the appropriate arrangements with his/her teachers due to any absences.

Late arrival or Tardy (excused/unexcused)

When a student arrives to class after the final class bell has rung:

- a. An excused tardy is when a student arrives to class after a schedule bell with an acceptable written excused pass from a teacher and/or support staff member.
- b. Students have a responsibility to arrive on time.
 - Unexcused tardies will be addressed by the teacher and school administration.
 - Letters will be mailed to families informing both the parent/guardian and the student of the accumulated tardies. School consequences will be administered for excessive tardiness.

Skyline's Tiered Response for Tardiness

As an incentive, students with no tardies for each week will have their name placed in a weekly raffle drawing for prizes. Five names will be drawn each week.

Tier 1

10 cumulative tardies

Teachers are communicating with families when a student has been tardy 4 or more times to their classroom. Skyline will mail a warning letter home when a student has accumulated 10 tardies.

Tier 2

20 cumulative tardies

Skyline will mail a second letter home and a discipline log entry is documented.

Tier 3

30 cumulative tardies

Skyline will mail a third letter home, a second discipline log entry is documented, and the student will be responsible for creating an informative essay, apology letter, and/or serving community service.

Tier 4

45 cumulative tardies

Skyline will mail a fourth letter home, third discipline log entry is documented, and the student will serve an after school detention. Administration will schedule a parent/guardian meeting.

"Truant" means a child who has ten (10) or more unexcused absences per school year. A child should be counted as truant only once in a given school year. Once a student is deemed truant, a child shall be monitored by a counselor or by a building level administrator.

Respect Inclusion & Kindness Week

Next week Skyline will celebrate Respect For All and Inclusion Week. This celebration is derived from the Spread the Word Campaign that originally worked to promote the end of using derogatory terms to describe people with disabilities. This campaign now focuses on inclusion for people with

disabilities and we celebrate Respect for All – no matter the disability, gender, race, etc. – each year to promote respect. So please be colorful and show your inclusive spirit.

Please allow for a few extra minutes before the start of your ceremony to participate in the screening process. All guests should be prepared to place their wallets, cell phone, and keys into a bin during the screening process.

The security measures include:

- All individuals will be subject to a metal detector screening upon entry into the Center.
