The primary goal of the AAPS summer school is to provide students who have completed grades 9-12 with a second opportunity to master or improve upon subject matter attempted during the prior school year. Enrichment credit opportunities are available. The program includes courses needed to meet the minimum Board of Education High School Graduation requirements. High School courses run as 3-hour blocks with a 5-minute break at the start of each hour. A maximum of two courses may be taken.

Tuition Information

- **AAPS Student:** \$250 per class
- **Out of District Student:** \$300 per class, plus \$25 book deposit
- No charge for students who have an incomplete (I) from the current year. If enrolling for an incomplete (I) class, you must bring the incomplete form from the teacher to registration.
- **Scholarships:** Limited scholarships are available on a sliding scale. Please see the principals at on-site registration.
- Online payment will be available through the online registration form. All payments are due at time of registration. Cash, check, Visa or Mastercard will be accepted. (There is a \$20 charge for returned checks.)
- **Cancelled Courses:** If a course is cancelled due to insufficient enrollment (minimum class size is 18), tuition paid for the class will be refunded in full. Students withdrawing from any class within the first three (3) days of summer school will receive a full refund. There will be no refunds after the first three days of class.

Credit and Grades

- Students receive .50 credit for each 3-hour class successfully completed.
- Students can earn a maximum of 1.0 unit of credit in summer school.
- There are three (3) marking periods over the six weeks.
- A progress report will be mailed home after the 8th day of school and a mid-term report 7 days later. After the final exam, a final grade will be mailed home and to the student's school.
- Students may not take a full year of a course. Only one semester is allowed at summer school.

Final Exams

- Final exams will not be given early. August 2 is the last day of class, no exception. Attendance is mandatory on the last day of school for the final exam. The final exam is a district common assessment when available.
- Class schedule on the last day for final exams: 8:00-9:30 am for the morning session; *and* 10:00-11:30 am for the afternoon session, with a 15 minute break in between exams.
- If a student is absent for the final exam, a grade of "E" will be recorded and averaged into the student's grade for the course.

Summer School Policies

- **Transportation** is available for currently enrolled AAPS students. See www.a2schools.org/summer for schedule. AAATA also runs public buses. The charge is \$.75, check www.theride.org for schedule information. Details will also be available during Parent Information night on June 13.
- **Attendance:** Due to the accelerated nature of Summer School, it is vitally important that students be at school every day. Any student who has more than three (3) absences in any class, regardless of the reason, will forfeit the credit, all fees and will be dismissed from summer school.
 - Each 3-hour block of the Summer School course work covers 3 days of material normally presented during the regular school year. Because of this, regular attendance is required. Vacation or medical appointments should not be scheduled during summer school hours.
 - Students are marked tardy if they are not in the classroom when the second bell rings. Any student who arrives more than ten (10) minutes late or leaves class early will be considered absent. Every three (3) tardies will equal one absence. Any student who accumulates more than three (3) absences by not being present, tardies, or combination of both, will be dismissed from summer school.
 - Late registrations will count toward the three-day absence policy.
- Special Education TCs and a media specialist will be available at summer school.
- **Textbook Obligations:** Textbooks are due on the last day of class.
- **Parking:** Students may park in the student lot.
- **Summer School Dress Policy:** Shirts and shoes must be worn in school at all times. Midriff tops, belly shirts, spaghetti straps, tank tops, hats, and bathing suits are not allowed to be worn while attending summer school. Shorts must be no shorter than where your fingers fall with your arms by your sides. The principal may send any student home who is not appropriately dressed according to this policy.
- **AAPS Rights & Responsibilities** are available online at www.a2schools.org. The same academic atmosphere will be expected during summer school as is during the school year. Disciplinary problems will not be tolerated. Students may be dismissed from summer school.
