


Early Childhood

Early Childhood Registrations 3-Year Trend






K-12 Programs

Youth Team Sports Mission Moment



As a parent this meant the world to me. It is also great for my sons to interact with a positive male."







Scholarship Participant Survey Key Feedback

- Improve registration process and communication about upcoming registration dates
- More scholarship spots per after school class
- More classes at Mitchell, Pittsfield, and other schools with higher % of Free/Reduced Meal participation

Part IV: Successes and Challenges



Rec & Ed's Successes

- Refreshed adult lifelong learning programming led to registration increase in fall 2017
- Targeted marketing campaigns led to increase in youth sports registrations
- Culture and practice of continuous improvement has improved internal processes and customer service (lots of TregoEd!)
- Training from the Weikert Center for Youth Program Quality for child care staff has infused more intentional community building activities
- Rec & Ed Pistons Day (12/8/2017) Fundraiser

Rec & Ed's Challenges

- Facilities (keeping buildings comfortable during summer camp programming, pools)
- Staffing for child care, weekend sports leagues
- Decline in coach volunteers for youth sports
- Keeping fees low as employment costs rise
- Decline in adult participation in traditional team sports

Focus for Next 2-5 Years


- Focus on program quality and exceptional customer service
- Adjusting to generational differences in how adults spend their leisure time
- New partnerships help us keep up with trends and continue deep Ann Arbor connections (University Musical Society, Flipside)
- Continued professional development for all staff
- Continued targeted marketing efforts started in 2014-15
