ANN ARBOR PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM

Twenty-one elementary schools, one alternative education facility, seven middle schools (including AAO and A2 Steam), four high schools; total enrollment for 2020-2021 is 17,451.



We are pleased to offer the complete range of IB programming in 9th - 12th grade at Huron High School. These programs are designed to address intellectual, social, emotional and physical well-being of students. For 9th and 10th grade, all Huron students participate in the Middle Years Programme (MYP). For 11th and 12th grade, Huron students have the choice to participate in either the Diploma Programme (DP) or Career-related Programme (CP). There are twenty-nine 11th grade full DP students, forty 12th grade full DP students, twenty-three 11th grade full CP and fifty-three 12th grade full CP students. Huron High School is the only school in Michigan to offer the MYP, DP and CP Programmes.

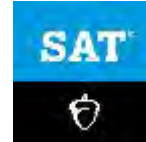

Huron is an IB World School. Students in 9th and 10th grade participate in the MYP Programme. The full IB Diploma Programme and IB Career Related Programme are offered to all 11th and 12th grade students. Additionally, Huron students are able to enroll in any DP classes in 11th or 12th grades.

All students pursuing the full IB Diploma or full IB Career-related Certificate also take the following courses to support the program core requirements throughout both 11th and 12th grade respectively:

- DP Core Advisory/Theory of Knowledge
- CP Core Advisory/Personal and Professional Skills

Approximately 50% of Huron 11th and 12th graders participate in at least one DP course and examination. Our results for May 2021 session awarded the IB Diploma at 79%, the Career-related Certificate at 87% and course averages above 4 at 90%.
