

# Rec & Ed Daily Pre-Screening for COVID-19 Symptoms and Exposure

Rec & Ed follows the <u>Ann Arbor Public School district's COVID-19 protocols</u>, which are based on recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control, American Academy of Pediatrics, and the Washtenaw County Health Department. The protocols aim to reduce the risk of coronavirus transmission during Rec & Ed activities but do not guarantee that it will not occur. AAPS Rec & Ed encourages participants ages 12+ to get vaccinated, as this is the most effective step that individuals can take to protect themselves and others.

### I agree to adhere to all COVID-19 safety protocols as currently required by the Ann Arbor Public Schools/Rec & Ed. These include:

- Pre Screening before coming onto AAPS property (see next side)
- Maintaining appropriate physical distance from others while on school property
- Wearing a mask at all times while within an AAPS facility (even for those individuals who
  are fully vaccinated)

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#### **PRE-SCREENING QUESTIONS**

You are responsible for reviewing and responding to the questions below <u>each</u> day that you attend an in-person Rec & Ed program.

1.	In the past 24 hours, have you experienced any of the following NEW or UNEXPECTED symptoms:

#### 2. In the past week, has anyone in your household been diagnosed with COVID-19?

If YES, you are considered a household close contact. Keep the infected person isolated from others. Follow the directions below depending on your vaccination status:

- <u>If you are vaccinated:</u> Continue regular activities if asymptomatic. Get a PCR test 3-5 days after exposure and mask up in all indoor spaces for 10 days from last exposure.
- <u>If you are unvaccinated</u>: Quarantine for 10 days from the date of last close contact with the infected individual. Get tested at least once during the quarantine period.
- 3. In the past week, have you been in close contact with anyone <u>outside the home</u> who has a confirmed or probable case of COVID-19? The WCHD defines a community "Close contact" as someone who spends 15+ minutes within 6 feet of an infected person.
